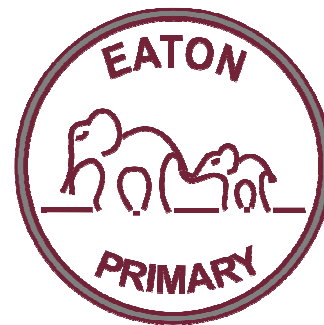

They are for different ages and there's a mix of something for everyone. For after school clubs we will need your written permission addressed to the teacher leading the club and children will need to attend each week.



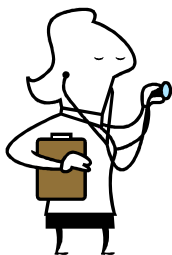

Hello my name is Lucy Barber, and I'm one of the newly elected Parent Governors. I wanted to take this opportunity to thank you for your support. I also wanted to share with you some of my experiences in this role so far. In November I was able to undertake some free training provided by Norfolk Governor Services to help new governors more fully understand their role and responsibilities, which I have found invaluable. As well as spending time at the school unofficially as a parent helper and in a PTA capacity, I have attended an assembly lead by Mr Portas in December, and more recently accompanied some of yrs. 5/6 on a visit to the UEA, organised by their new teacher Mrs Wells. In both instances I was impressed with the communication with, and involvement of, the children. The assembly dealt sensitively with the issue of staff and children moving on. The year 5/6 pupils were given some great drama workshops at school where they had to pretend to have various ailments (!) on the run up to the visit. The purpose being that they were then interviewed, alongside a professional actor, by 4th yr. medical students on the visit. The students had to work out how to relate to them and make a diagnosis. Beware parents, we had some very convincing performances, and the course tutors were all very impressed!!! This was followed up by a small workshop to demonstrate how makeup is used in films by getting the children to paint bruises on their wrists, again some were scary life like! Safe to say both the children and the students got an enormous amount out of the visit, and it was great to form another link with the local community.
